

SUMMARY OF PROGRAM

IMPORTANT: “Hope Is Moving In” provides temporary services to households who are homeless or would be homeless *but for* this assistance. Resources will be targeted and prioritized to households that are most in need of temporary assistance and are most likely to achieve stable housing after the program concludes. There are many people who are housed and have additional needs, but would not become homeless if they did not receive HPRP assistance. In some cases, the household may need more intensive supportive services or long-term assistance, or the household is not at risk of homelessness, providers will work to link them to other appropriate available resources and assistance.
